The Maine WasteWater Control Association (MWWCA) was in the news on January 21, when the Portland Press Herald reported on a pilot project with INDA (the Association of Nonwoven Fabrics Industry) to educate the public on the flush-ability of baby wipes. This expensive and international problem has been proactively addressed in Maine, where in 2011 they attempted a labeling law delineating the criteria for "flushable". Although the law was not passed this eight week joint effort maybe a model for the country.

Aubrey Strause, MWWCA President, indicated qualitative and quantitative assessment components to the study. Portland has installed screens to trap bulky solids which will be sorted at the beginning and the end of the education campagin. Individual surveys will determine which method of education is most effective. Less baby wipes at the end of the campaign would indicate successful education then the survey will determine which education componet reached the those pushing the lever.
